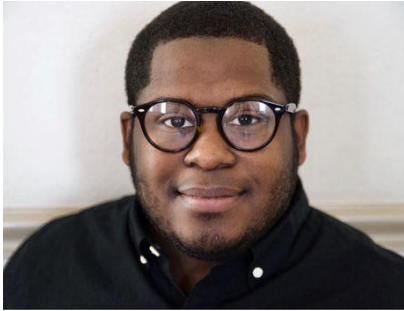


Chaequan Anderson

CHAEQUAN ANDERSON is an American tenor, keyboardist, conductor, and teacher. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Music from Westminster Choir College of Rider University where he studied the choral arts, vocal performance, conducting, and music education. With the Westminster Symphonic Choir, he sang Beethoven's 9th Symphony with Philadelphia Orchestra and Berlin Philharmonic at Carnegie Hall. He also sang Gustav Mahler's Resurrection Symphony No. 2 with the Philadelphia Orchestra. With the Westminster Choir,

Chaequan performed in one of the first fully staged performances of John Adam's *El Niño* at Spoleto Festival USA in Charleston, South Carolina. Chaequan made his professional solo debut as the tenor soloist in Mozart's Requiem Mass with the VOICES Chorale of Hopewell.

As a teacher and conductor, Chaequan has held positions with Princeton Girlchoir (PGC), Trenton Children's Chorus (TCC), and Christina Seix Academy. Chaequan was also the Choirmaster for the Rho Kappa Chapter of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia Fraternity (PMA), America's largest male music fraternity. Currently, Chaequan serves as Organist at Neshanic United Methodist Church and Director of Middle School Choirs at Montclair Kimberley Academy.
