Rochelle Ellis, D. M. A., is a Lecturer of Voice at Princeton University and recently retired after 28 years as an Adjunct Associate Professor of Voice at Westminster Choir College of Rider University. As a performer, she has sung with leading conductors and venues around the world, including New York City Opera and Carnegie Hall.

Active in community outreach in music, Dr. Ellis is currently a Faculty Fellow with Trenton Arts at Princeton. She has taught frequently in the summer Westminster High School Vocal Institute and has served as Teaching Artist for The Princeton Festival Guild and as a director with Trenton Children's Chorus.

The St. Louis native received her Doctor of Musical Arts degree in Voice from the Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University, a Master of Music Education degree from Westminster Choir College of Rider University and a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Missouri-Kansas City Conservatory of Music.
